

Dreamy Duskywing

Dreamy Duskywings are rare in Alabama, only known from Jackson County. They are univoltine and fly solely in the spring. This species inhabits rich, moist woodlands . Flight is very low, often only a foot above the ground. Males perch very low—even on the ground-- to find females and frequently mineralize with other duskywings.

- Small—the smallest of the duskywings.
- Sexes are similar. Males have a costal fold on the ventral forewing. They tend to be darker than females.
- Keep in mind that palps can be lost with age and wear.
- May be confused with Sleepy Duskywings. Dreamies are smaller. They have a small forewing spot near the leading edge that Sleepies lack. Their abdomens are often ringed with gray; Sleepies seldom exhibit these rings. Dreamy DW's have a more silvery-gray coloration, especially when fresh. Dreamies tend to inhabit richer habitats than Sleepies. They are not nearly as common and fly somewhat later, although there is an overlap.
