

Gulf Fritillary

Gulf Fritillaries are very common and widespread in Alabama. Since they are not cold hardy, they must recolonize the state from more southerly locations each year and are typically not encountered until early summer. They become extremely common in the fall. Open, sunny habitats are preferred. Gulf Fritillaries are avid nectarers.

- Sexes are similar, but there are subtle differences. Females are slightly larger, more heavily marked, and have blunter, less elongated wings.
- May be confused with Variegated Fritillaries and Monarchs. Gulf Fritillaries' silver-spotted ventral wings are distinctive. Dorsally, they are much brighter orange than Variegated Fritillaries. Gulf Frits have dark spots on ventral wings that Monarchs lack; they lack the heavy black veining that is typical of Monarchs.



FEMALE: Heavier black markings; wings less pointed
