

Zabulon Skipper

Zabulon Skippers are widespread in Alabama; they are common in the upper two-thirds of the state. Zabulons are on the wing spring through fall. Preferred habitat is grassy areas near woodlands and forests. Males perch to look for females and aggressively defend these perches. Females tend to prefer somewhat shady areas. Both sexes avidly nectar at a variety of flowers.

- A medium-sized skipper
- Sexes are strongly dimorphic. Males are bright yellow orange. There is no stigma. Females are dark purple-brown with a distinct white edge on the costal edge of the hindwing.
- May be confused with Hobomok Skipper. Female may be confused with Clouded Skipper. Zabulons are much more common and widespread than Hobomoks. Zabulon males have rusty dots within the large golden patch on ventral hindwings; Hobomok males lack these dots. Zabulon males have a ventral “golden shoulder” that Hobomoks lack. Dorsally, Zabulon males have a dark mark and line near forewing apex that tend to be unconnected; Hobomok males tend to have an S-shaped dark mark. The golden dorsal hindwing patch in male Zabs is not divided by veins as it is in Hobomoks. Zabulon females have a white coastal hindwing edge that Hobomok females lack. Ventral hindwing has an indistinct dark, smudgy line that Hobomoks lack. Dorsally, Zabulon females lack an isolated mid-forewing dot that “Pocohontas” form Hobomok females have. Female Zabulons have two submarginal spots on ventral forewing that Clouded Skippers lack.

Dorsal Male

Bright gold to golden-orange; no stigma

Variable dark patch and dark line: often unconnected

Dark borders not extremely wide

Orange patch is solid—not divided by dark veins
